WORLD CHOCOLATE DAY

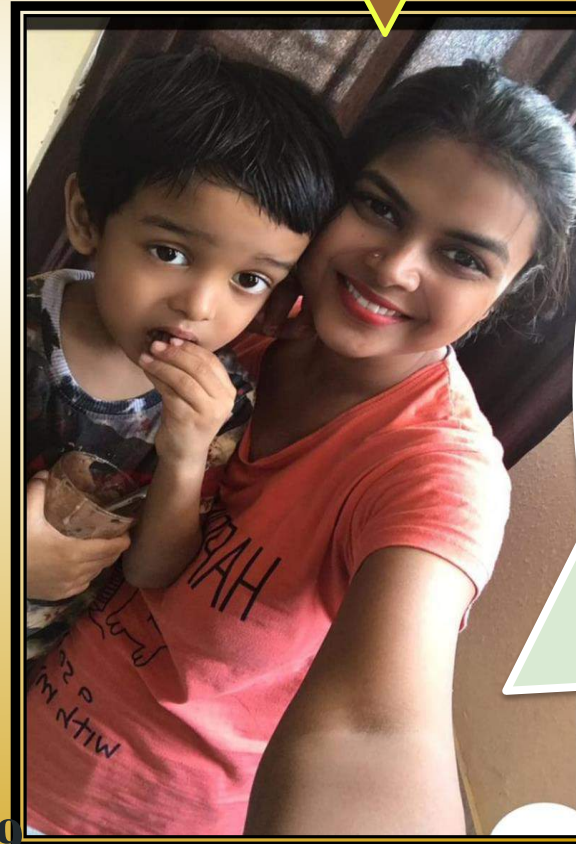

MOCK INDIAN PARLIAMENT



On July 26, 2021, the school organised the 'Mock Indian Parliament' for the students of classes XI and XII. It was an endeavour to apprise them about the multi-layered processes that go behind policy-making and governance in India. There were two committees representing Lok Sabha and Rajya Sabha, comprising 20 delegates each. They were allotted topics as follows -

- Lok Sabha: Infrastructure development project in border areas for armed forces
- Rajya Sabha: Media- a pillar or a leech?

The different categories were-

1. Caricatures - Headed by Malavika Mahesh and Shreya Kataria (XII C)
2. Journalists - Headed by Anushka Sekhani and Bhavneet Kaur (XII C)
3. Moderators of Lok Sabha - Disha Sharma, Srijan Kar and Aakash Kannan (XII C)
4. Moderators of Rajya Sabha - Kashish Kapoor and Navya Anand (XII C)

The organising committee comprised Dr. K. K. Sharma and Ms Seema Barera along with students from class XII C.

The sessions of Lok Sabha and Rajya Sabha began with a roll call. It was followed by heated discussions on drone technology, border surveillance in Lok Sabha and Indira Gandhi's call for emergency as well as Press Censorship in Rajya Sabha.



The Head of Journalists divided the participants into groups and sent them to attend the public session of each committee. Journalists were sent back to breakout rooms in private sessions and were asked to draft their reports on the basis of their observations in the public session.

The Head of Caricatures also divided participants into different committees. The caricaturists drew cartoons, comic strips etc. criticizing a leader, describing the agenda etc.

The session concluded with delegates forming their directives i.e. an official document for all solutions and clauses.

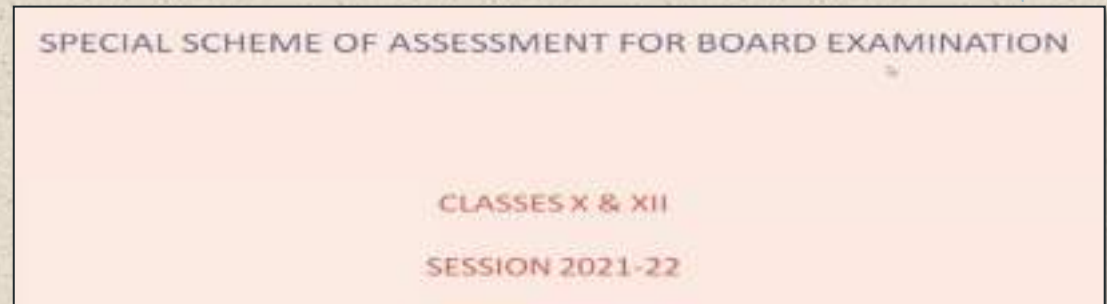
PARENT ORIENTATION PROGRAMME
